Pathlights offers HomeMeds[™] to help older adults who:

- Receive prescriptions from multiple doctors.
- Take over-the-counter medications.
- Experience frequent falls or dizziness.
- Had a recent hospitalization/ER visit.

How does it work?

- An inventory of prescriptions, over-the-counter medications, and any supplements are entered into a web-based tool.
- The program assesses the inventory for duplications, NSAIDS (such as Ibuprofen and Tylenol), and other potential medication risks.
- A pharmacist reviews the HomeMeds analysis and identified risks.
- Your prescribing physician is notified by the pharmacist of risks and the need to act on behalf of their patient.





Only you and your doctor can decide about the right medications for you. Your Pathlights Care Coordinator and the HomeMeds program do not have the authority to make changes to your medications. We take rigorous steps to keep your information confidential. There is no fee for this service.
